Pohutukawa Room Airport Gateway Motor Lodge 45 Roydvale Avenue	<p>Welcome and briefing:</p> <p>Overview of the education situation in Christchurch prior to and after the two major earthquakes and subsequent aftershocks. The Feb 22, 2011 earthquake resulted in the closure of over 20 schools for varying periods of time as damage was repaired and geotechnical reports were produced. Over 7000 students needed to be moved twice daily across to the more unaffected, western side of the city. Primary schools were doubled up and secondary schools ran in a “two-shift format.”</p> <p>The Ministry of Education has been working with schools and their communities to produce a future network of schools that reflects the changing demographics of the city and the challenges of working with unstable ground.</p> <p>This session will provide the context for the two school visits we will be making, with an additional emphasis on planning and opportunities for schooling in Christchurch for the future.</p> <p>Tea/coffee and morning tea</p>	9.45 -10.45am
Site visit one: Redcliffs School	Redcliffs School is a seaside primary school with a roll of about 300 students at the time of the earthquake. It lies at the base of a volcanic lava flow (hence it’s name). The face of this cliff fell onto the rear of the school and the school was evacuated to another nearby school for 6 weeks while the stability of the cliff was investigated. The school was then shifted for a second time to its present location and is there until at least the end of	11.30 - 12.30

	2013. It is still unknown if the school can return to its original site.

<b>Site visit two: Avonside Girls High School</b>	<p>This will entail an overview of the school's experience and their plans for the future.</p> <p>Avonside Girls High School provides a single sex option for about 1200 girls in the eastern part of the city. Its riverside location meant it was particularly susceptible to liquefaction during the earthquake. The students were then transferred on a daily basis to Burnside High School (near Christchurch Airport) for their schooling. Subsequent damage investigations resulted in about 90% of the school being demolished over the course of 2011, and a new prefab/modular school being built in time for the start of the 2012 school year.</p> <p>Geotechnical reports indicate that the school can be rebuilt on the site, but a final decision is yet to be made about the long-term future of the school.</p>	1.45 - 2.45
